- Progress records to include relevant history, physical examination findings, investigation results and treatment. 3 – 5 progress records are required, including the final entry.

Cases must be submitted at least 1 month before the Course for vetting by the experts.

A participant whose case is accepted for discussion will be given free registration to attend the Course. He/she will also be invited to provide additional information as resource person, during the case discussion.
